Cork City Council Permission is sought by Luke O'Shea for development at 14 Maheen Terrace, Rope Walk, Blackrock, Cork, T12 E1W4. The development will consist of the renovation and extension of the existing two-storey end-of-terrace dwelling, comprising: removal of the existing roof and its replacement to match the existing ridge height; a two-storey flat-roofed extension to the rear finished in architectural rain screen cladding; alterations to existing window and door openings and the provision of new windows and doors; a rooflight to the front roof plane over the stairwell; internal reconfiguration of the dwelling to provide four bedrooms and associated accommodation; an upgrade of the building fabric with mechanical ventilation with heat recovery; a soakaway for the disposal of surface water; and all associated site development, drainage and ancillary works. The planning application may be inspected, or purchased at a fee not exceeding the reasonable cost of making a copy, at the offices of the Planning Authority, City Hall, Cork, during its public opening hours. A submission or observation in relation to the application may be made in writing to the Planning Authority on payment of the prescribed fee of €20 within the period of 5 weeks beginning on the date of receipt by the Authority of the application, and such submissions or observations will be considered by the Planning Authority in making a decision on the application. The Planning Authority may grant permission subject to or without conditions, or may refuse to grant permission.

Cork County Council Oliver Farrell and Tracey Daly are applying for Planning Permission for A Rural Retreat / Activity Centre to include short-term letting accommodation, to comprise of the following: a. Change of use of existing dwellinghouse from year-round occupation use to short-term letting use, including communal use of the kitchen to serve the retreat / activity centre. b. Demolition of 2 number farm buildings. c. Change of use of one number existing farm building from agricultural use to communal toilet and laundry usage. d. Reconstruction and change of use of one number existing farm building from agricultural use to general purpose room and construction of single storey extension to said building to provide kitchenette and accessible wc to serve the general-purpose room. e. Construction of 2 number structures providing 4 number single storey accommodation units for short-term letting. f. Construction of wastewater treatment system and all associated site works, at Gurrane, Caheragh, Dromoleague, Co. Cork, P47 EY06. The Planning Authority may grant permission subject to or without conditions, or may refuse to grant permission.

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
